What does it take to be a My Career Advancement Account Scholarship school?

- ✓ Be accredited Department of Education, a state board or a DoD-approved industry regulating body is acceptable.
- ✓ **Offer portability** School's education and training programs will provide My Career Advancement Account Scholarship spouses with a certificate or associate degree (excluding general studies and liberal arts) which will assist spouses with obtaining careers that will move with them.
- ✓ **Support your students** School must extend the Servicemembers Opportunity Colleges Military Student Bill of Rights to My Career Advancement Account Scholarship spouses.
- ✓ Provide program documentation Provide program documentation to military spouses to show a plan of action.
- ✓ **Maintain standards of truth and fairness** Maintain standards of truth and fairness when recruiting students.
